### NEBC TO LEAD MEMBER DELEGATION TO WASHINGTON DC

As part of our ongoing government affairs effort for NEBC, David Welsh will be leading a small group of member firms on a mission to Washington, DC. The mission will focus on the following:

- Briefings with Northwest Congressional Representatives and Senators
- Follow-up on new Brownfield's legislation, HR 2869
- Follow-up on new Watershed Enhancement legislation
- Meetings with US EPA ETV Program officials
- Meetings with US EPA Office of Research and Development officials
- Other meetings with US Department of Commerce, US Asia Environmental Partnership, and other agency officials

The mission will be an excellent opportunity to learn about what's going on in the other Washington that affects our industry. The agenda has not been completely outlined yet and will be partially determined by those attending. A small number of positions are available. The mission is scheduled for April 9-11, 2002. Participating firms will be responsible for travel and accommodation costs. ## WASHINGTON LEGISLATURE OFF TO FAST START

The Washington Legislature is off to a very fast start in 2002. All of the bills that were introduced last year are still eligible for consideration, and hundreds of new measures have been added already this year. Funding transportation projects continues to be the primary focus for this Session. Now that the Democrats hold a slim majority in both the House and Senate, expectations are high that a plan will finally emerge from the Legislature. However, there are still many differences of opinion regarding the amount of funding to be provided, who would pay those costs, what regions would be allowed to increase taxes for regional transportation projects, and what, if anything, will require voter approval.

For the environmental industry, NEBC is focusing on two key issues. The first is to protect the tax advantages enjoyed by environmental companies through the High Technology Research and Development Tax Incentives, and the reduced Business & Occupation Tax rates for studies and remediation actions on cleanup sites. There is intense pressure on the Legislature to find new revenues to cover a significant budget shortfall, and all of the existing tax preferences are "on the table." NEBC is coordinating with other affected industries to preserve these benefits. We are working to demonstrate to legislators that the environmental and economic value inherent in these programs should not be eliminated.

NEBC is also working to protect and expand the contracting program we established two years ago for outside technical support in processing environmental permits. Many of our member environmental companies have been contracted to provide services under this program, and it has been successful in moving several large projects and water rights applications more rapidly through the permitting process. Our efforts are focused on defending the program against the complaints of a few who are concerned about the costs of consultants' efforts and diversion of resources from smaller projects. Instead, we are urging the Legislature to expand this program, and make the contracted technical support available to a broader range of permit applications.

The Legislature is also considering options to restructure the Environmental Excellence Program. This program was established several years ago to create flexibility in meeting environmental objectives in environmental permitting. However, to date only one applicant has participated in the program. Suggestions on how to improve the program and make it more valuable to industry clients would be welcomed. ## ISOPROPYL ALCOHOL DISTILLATION NEEDED

Company is interested in on-site recycling opportunities for isopropyl alcohol (IPA). The IPA is used as a surface cleaner, and the spent solution contains IPA, water and some adhesive materials that are cleaned off the parts. The concentration of IPA in the waste is 60% or greater. It is believed that conventional distillation equipment may not be designed to effectively remove the water fraction, and thus, is looking for a more sophisticated type of distillation method or another type of reclamation system. ## ENVIRONMENTAL TECHNOLOGY VERIFICATION PROGRAM

Here are a few highlights of the EPA ETV Program for the past month. NEBC continues its work with ETV and we welcome updates from members on your interaction with the program. If you would like to explore the application of ETV technologies, please contact NEBC staff. We are especially interested in vendors seeking to submit a technology for verification or consultants applying a verified technology in the market. The ETV Program has verified more than 160 technologies to date. The latest is the following:

### **WATERSHED PROTECTION TECHNOLOGIES TO BE TESTED, VENDORS INVITED**

A protocol for UV disinfection of secondary wastewater effluent and wastewater reuse applications is under review. The protocol encompasses elements of the NWR/AAWWARF protocol "Ultraviolet Disinfection Guidelines for Drinking Water and Water Reuse," and will provide verification opportunities for the broad spectrum of wastewater treatment applications available to the UV industry. Testing by the ETV Source Water Protection Technology Pilot will begin later this spring at a wastewater treatment facility, which is also being used by the Wet Weather Flow Technology Pilot for stormwater treatment systems verification. ### **STORMWATER TREATMENT TECHNOLOGY TESTING UNDERWAY**

One vendor, Zeta Technology, Inc., is testing their Arkal Filtration System, which is a pressurized filtration technology for treatment of stormwater runoff, under the ETV Wet Weather Flow Technology Pilot. The testing location is a parking lot of St. Mary's Hospital in Green Bay, WI, where runoff from this parking is being treated. ### **WATER TREATMENT VERIFIED**

The ETV Drinking Water Treatment Systems Center has verified the performance of Osmonics, Inc, Model PS 150 Ozone Disinfection System for application in inactivation of *Cryptosporidium parvum* (*Cyptosporidium parvum*) Oocyst and determination of concentration-time (CT) values as a surrogate for *Giardia Lamblia* (*Giardia Lamblia*) and virus inactivation in drinking water. The verification statement and report, jointly signed by representatives of EPA and partner organization, National Sanitation Foundation, will be posted on the ETV website in the very near future. ### **PORTABLE ARSENIC WATER ANALYZERS TESTED**

Four vendors of portable arsenic water analyzers participated in the ETV Advanced Monitoring Systems Center's verification test, which began in October and was completed early in November. The technologies were tested for monitoring arsenic in the 1-100 parts per billion (ppb) range in fresh water, well water, and public drinking water. ### **DECENTRALIZED (ON-SITE) WASTEWATER TREATMENT SYSTEMS FOR RESIDENTIAL NUTRIENT REDUCTION TESTING UNDERWAY**

Four vendors are participating in the ETV Source Water Protection Technology Pilot's verification testing with residential nutrient reduction technologies at the field test location on Cape Cod, MA. Three of these vendors: F.R. Mahony & Associates, Waterloo Systems, Inc., and AWT Environmental will be completing their test cycle in March 2002. The third vendor, Septitech, Inc., started testing late last year and will complete the required 12-month schedule later this year. A fifth vendor, Bio-Microbics, Inc., has a technology installed at an alternate test facility located in Vancouver, B.C., and is currently in the early months of testing. ### COURSES IN CONTAMINANT TRANSPORT AND FATE

**Fundamentals of Subsurface Transport and Fate** (GHYD-402) will be held March 4 – 6, 2002 at the OXARC Training Center, Spokane, Washington, from 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM. This three-day course will provide participants with an improved understanding of the fundamental processes governing transport and fate of contaminants in the subsurface. Participants will learn the chemical, hydrogeologic, and biological factors affecting the migration of contaminants in soil and groundwater and general methods for modeling these factors.

**Modeling Tools for Estimating Subsurface Transport and Fate of Contaminants** (GHYD-403) will be held March 7, 2002 at the New Horizons Computer Learning Center, Spokane, Washington, from 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM. This course will provide participants with an improved understanding of the modeling fundamentals and the application of several modeling software packages. Each participant will have their own computer workstation to apply course concepts and methodologies to real world examples. Participants will learn general methods for modeling the chemical, hydrogeologic, and biologic factors affecting the migration of contaminants in soil and groundwater.
