CALL FOR EPA SUCCESS STORIES

On December 5, 2001 NEBC together with Preston Gates & Ellis hosted a small luncheon between John Iani, Regional Administrator, EPA Region 10, NEBC sponsoring members and Washington Chapter board members. Mr. Iani was appointed to the position in October and has been busy acquainting himself with his new staff and the issues facing the region. NEBC members welcomed Mr. Iani and expressed interest in working with the agency on several key issues including salmon protection, regional superfund sites, as well as others. NEBC members encouraged Mr. Iani and EPA to utilize the flexibility and discretion afforded them within regulations when faced with implementing innovative approaches. The group also voiced support for the Environmental Technology Verification Program in the region.

As a result of the meeting NEBC agreed to poll its members seeking examples of instances where EPA staff have applied innovative thinking to a particular situation. If you have worked with EPA in the past few years and can provide an example of how it went right with the agency please give us the details of the situation. We are looking for specifics whenever possible of innovative, creative, and effective efforts on the part of EPA personnel. By highlighting these instances, Mr. Iani hopes to build upon those successes and duplicate those efforts whenever possible.

ENVIRONMENTAL TECHNOLOGY VERIFICATION PROGRAM

Here are a few highlights of the EPA ETV Program for the past month. NEBC continues its work with ETV and we welcome updates from members on your interaction with the program. If you would like to explore the application of ETV technologies, please contact NEBC staff. We are especially interested in vendors seeking to submit a technology for verification or consultants applying a verified technology in the market. The ETV Program has verified more than 160 technologies to date. The latest is the following:

POLLUTION CONTROL DEVICE VERIFIED

The ETV Greenhouse Gas Technology Center has verified the performance of a new pollution control device developed by Honeywell Power Systems, Inc. (formerly AlliedSignal Power Systems), Albuquerque, NM, in cooperation with the University of Maryland, College Park, MD. Honeywell's Parallon 75 Kw Turbogenerator with CO emissions control operates on natural gas at a fuel pressure ranging from 75 to 125 psig. The CO emissions control device is an option to the standard turbogenerator that is designed to reduce CO emissions. 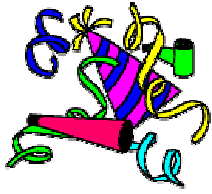
