The State of Oregon (the "State") Department of Environmental Quality ("DEQ"), invites written Statements of Qualifications ("SOQs") from Consultants to assist the Land Quality Division in the investigation and remediation of environmental cleanup projects. This Request for Qualifications (RFQ) will establish a list of qualified Consultants. It includes minimum requirements to be responsive. Proposers qualifications will be evaluated and scored. All who respond will receive a letter stating whether they made the qualified list. Those that make the qualified list will receive a Request for Proposal (RFP). Technical Proposals will be evaluated, oral presentations will be made, and DEQ anticipates selecting multiple Consultants. The selected Proposers will enter into negotiations with DEQ. Agreement to Agree type contracts ("ATAs") will be awarded to multiple Consultants, and Task Orders will be assigned to specific Consultants based on the process described in Section 1.04 of the RFQ. Task Orders will be cost-plus-fixed fee. The term of the ATAs will be 1-year with the ability to renew for an additional four (4) 1-year periods.

NEW BROWNFIELDS GRANT AVAILABLE FROM EPA IN 2003 APPLICATIONS DUE NOVEMBER 22, 2002

The Brownfields Law passed January 11, 2002 authorized a new and improved federal Brownfields Grants Program. Some of the changes include a new cleanup grant program and a broader definition of brownfields, which will allow more sites to be addressed. Brownfields sites are "real property, the expansion, redevelopment or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant." For these grants this includes "relatively low-risk" petroleum sites, mine-scarred lands, and drug labs. However, Superfund National Priority List Sites are not eligible for funding.

There are four competitive Brownfields grant programs: Assessment Grants, the new direct Cleanup Grants, Cleanup Revolving Loan Fund Grants, and Job Training Grants. Applicants can apply for any or all programs. EPA plans to publish draft Grant Proposal Guidelines on its website (www.epa.gov/brownfields) Sept. 18, 2002 with final Guidelines available by mid-October. The Guidelines will describe the Grant programs, eligible activities, and how to apply. Phase 1 Grant applications are due to EPA November 22, 2002 for funding in the summer, 2003. Applicants cannot get grant or loan funding to work on sites for which they are potentially liable under CERCLA (Superfund) section 107, as amended by the new brownfields law.
