WASHINGTON LEGISLATURE WRAPS UP WITH POSITIVE RESULTS FOR ENVIRONMENTAL COMPANIES

NEBC was deeply involved in the 2004 legislative session in Washington. Two of our top legislative priorities were achieved, and we were able to "make lemonade out of lemons" on other issues that came up unexpectedly. NEBC also had a successful third annual Environmental Industry Day on the Hill, with several NEBC members visiting the Capitol, meeting with legislators and observing the legislative process.

Tax Incentives for Research & Development in Environmental Technology

The environmental industry in Washington was instrumental in enacting tax incentives for R&D activities in high technology industries in 1994. Many of our member companies have used these tax incentives to save millions of dollars in Business & Occupation Tax, but the tax benefits were scheduled to expire this year. Extending them has been a top priority of NEBC for the last two years. We worked with the other high tech industries this year to pass legislation that extends these tax benefits for another ten years. The negotiated legislation requires additional reporting to evaluate the economic benefits to the state, and raises the threshold of R&D activity to obtain the tax benefits. Considering the overall economic condition of the state, the renewal of these tax incentives is a major victory for the environmental industry and other high tech businesses in the state.

The R&D definition includes many environmental projects done by NEBC companies under contract for their clients. Modifying software, adapting cleanup technologies to new or different site conditions, and many other activities may qualify for these tax savings. Opportunity for Consulting on Projects Identified by Port Districts

The port districts in Washington sought legislation this year to allow ports to receive compensation for consulting work related to any kind of port activities. Their stated objective was to be able to recover costs incurred when foreign ports or other governmental agencies ask for their advice and support on port-related issues. However, the language of the bill was very open-ended. Some testimony suggested that the broad authority in this proposal could be abused by some port districts to seek new revenues by soliciting consulting contracts on projects that are normally conducted by environmental and engineering companies. NEBC worked with the bill's sponsors, other legislators and the port districts to amend the bill to prevent such unfair competition by the public sector. These protections were included in the bill that passed by the Legislature and signed by Governor Locke. NEBC will be meeting with the ports in the near future to assure that our members will have an opportunity to participate in any new business generated by the ports' contacts and relationships with other ports and government agencies. It was only because of NEBC's daily presence during the Legislative Session that we were able to identify this potential threat to our businesses, and "make lemonade out of lemons" in creating potential new opportunities for our members.

Competition from Correctional Industries

Another unanticipated "lemonade" experience involved legislation revising provisions relating to correctional industries. In the past, NEBC has staved off efforts to expand correctional industry work programs into the area of environmental services such as asbestos remediation and underground tank removal. NEBC worked this year to support legislation that limits the expansion of correctional industries. The bill that passed includes provisions that prevent the creation or expansion of correctional industries that would compete unfairly with any existing Washington business. This broad prohibition should reduce the need for case-by-case defense against unfair competition with private sector businesses.

Protecting the Office of Regulatory Assistance, and Contracting for Permit Support

Several years ago, NEBC was instrumental in creating a cost-reimbursement program that allowed permit applicants to pay for added technical resources for more expeditious processing of environmental permits. Last year, we led the effort in the Legislature to expand this program, making it available for large and small projects. The Office of Regulatory Assistance (formerly the Permit Assistance Center) coordinates these agreements, and contracts with environmental and engineering consultants to perform the e services. A number of NEBC member companies have been awarded contracts under this program to assist in processing water rights and other environmental permits. However, there has been some effort to reduce or eliminate this program, and to make significant changes in permit processes in the interest of "competitiveness" and "streamlining." Although noble goals, some of the direction these efforts may take would be detrimental to the environment as well as to our businesses. NEBC was able to raise these concerns with the Legislature and avoid some of the potentially damaging directives favored by some. This will be a continuing challenge, which will be addressed in greater detail in a future E-News.

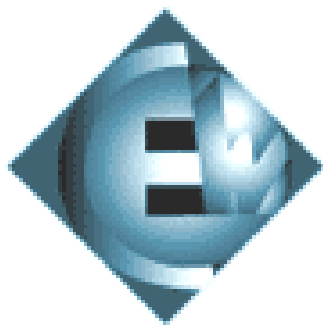
