- GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS -

WASHINGTON LEGISLATURE UNDER WAY

The legislative session in Washington has gotten off to a slower than usual start. It is always a slower pace during the “long” session that occurs in odd-numbered years and includes passage of the biennial budget. However, this year things are moving even at a slower pace. With the Democrats in charge of the legislative and executive branches, you would normally assume that they would be moving in the same direction. But the controversial election has created a significant amount of tension between both parties. Also, the House tends to move more boldly on legislative issues, while the Senate is considered the more deliberative body. With a small majority, and a handful of very independent members, they are testing the waters as they move out on any legislative issues.

Despite this slow pace, we have been very busy on issues dealing with the environmental industry. NEBC has gotten a bill introduced to reinstate the favorable tax treatment of environmental remediation activities. This program has saved thousands of dollars in state tax for many environmental companies, but the incentives expired in 2003. It will be an uphill battle to get these incentives renewed during the state’s continuing budget pressures. We have gotten the support of the Association of Washington Business and others on this measure, and will be asking for help from member companies to get the Legislature to pass this bill. Look for further information from NEBC on how you can help.

NEBC is also working to give direction to the state economic development agency to work directly with “industry clusters” such as the environmental industry to improve the market position of local companies, and enhance economic development strategies. We are also looking at a variety of specific proposals, including creation of a state department of archeology and historic preservation, licensing soil scientist, and other issues that affect our industry. Call the NEBC office if you would like to receive a list of the bills we are tracking and working on,

In addition to these issues, the Hanford Initiative to limit new radioactive waste coming into the Hanford site will possibly be revisited during the legislative session. While Initiative 297 passed with a significant majority, it has been challenged by the federal government on constitutional issues. Meanwhile, a number of legislators from both parties have stepped forward trying to address some of the questions raised by I-297. Several bills have been drafted aimed at assuring that promising new businesses doing medical research and developing isotopes will not be harmed by the Initiative’s passage. This is important to some of our members that do research work, or are active in the business community in the Tri Cities. As these measures advance, there will likely be publicity aimed at protecting the initiative, as well as furthering the environmental cleanup at Hanford.
